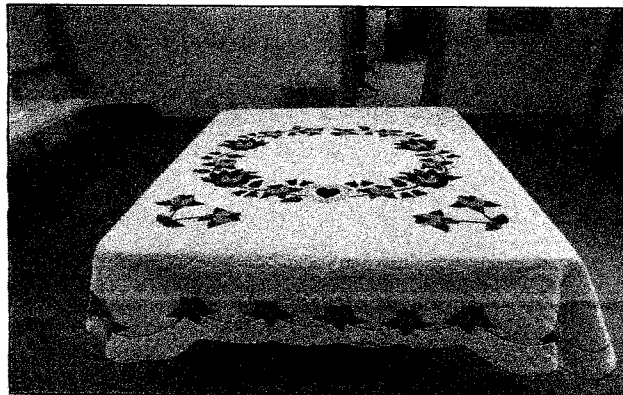
Monday, October 23, 7 p.m. **CALENDAR**
